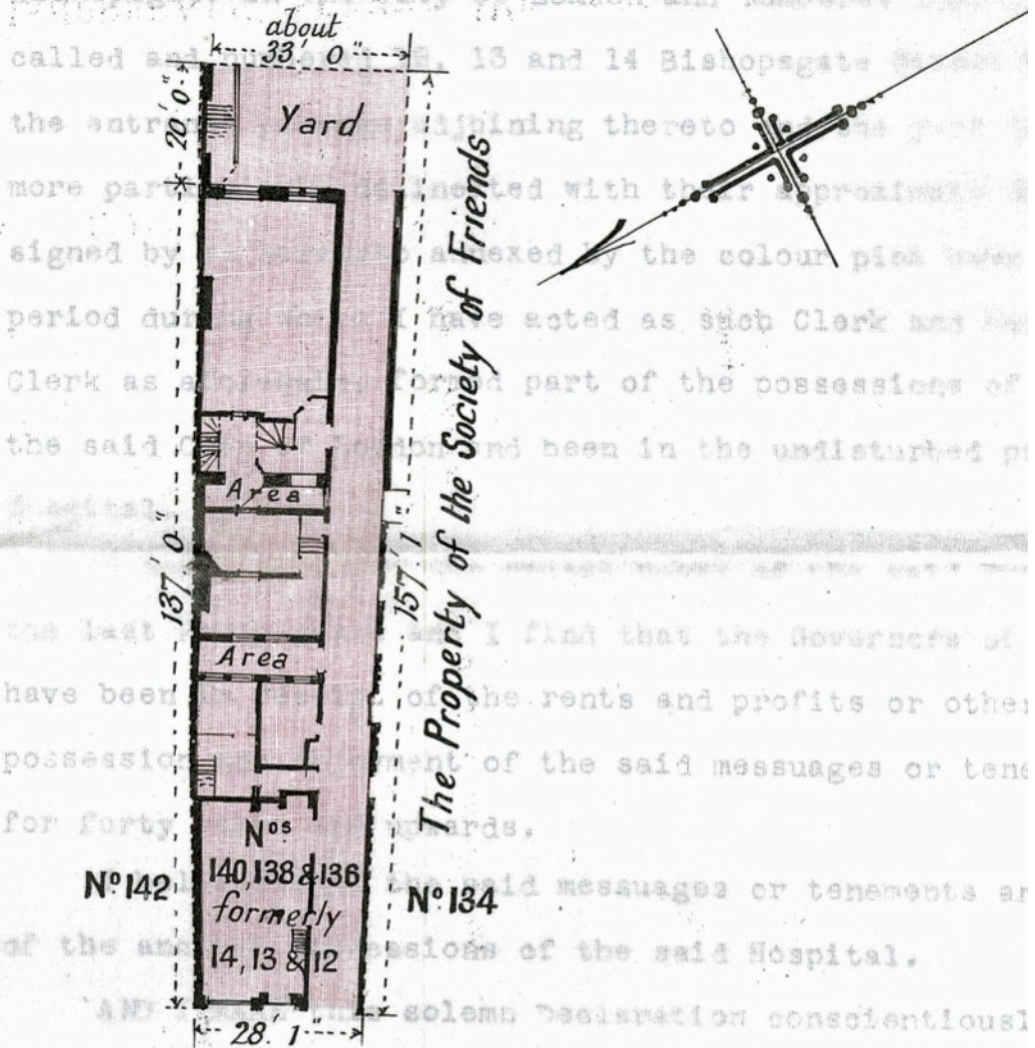

JOHN LADE WORSFOLD of Bridewell Hospital New Bridge Street in the City of London Gentleman SOLEMNLY and SINCERELY DECLARE as follows :-

1. I am now and have been for the past ten years and upwards the Clerk and Receiver of the Mayor and Commonalty and Citizens of the City of London Masters Guardians and Governors of the House and Hospital called Bethlem situate without and near to Bishopsgate of the said City of London and before my appointment of Clerk and Receiver I was Assistant Clerk to the said Hospital for seventeen years and upwards. As such Clerk and Receiver and Assistant Clerk I am well acquainted with the possessions belonging to the said Hospital.
2. THE messuages or tenements and premises situate on the East side of Bishopsgate in the City of London and Numbered 136, 138 and 140 but formerly called and numbered 12, 13 and 14 Bishopsgate Street Without Together with the entrance passage adjoining thereto and the yard in the rear thereof more particularly delineated with their approximate dimensions on the plan signed by me hereunto annexed by the colour pink have throughout the whole period during which I have acted as such Clerk and Receiver and Assistant Clerk as aforesaid, formed part of the possessions of the said Hospital in the said City of London and been in the undisturbed possession of the said Hospital.
3. I have inspected the rental books of the said Hospital for more than the last Forty years and I find that the Governors of the said Hospital have been in receipt of the rents and profits or otherwise in undisputed possession and enjoyment of the said messuages or tenements and premises for forty years and upwards.
4. I believe that the said messuages or tenements and premises form part of the ancient possessions of the said Hospital.
