This month has been decidedly warm, for the mean daily temperature generally averaged above 44°, once it was as low as 37°. The maximum of the 26th indicated freezing, for the first time this season; the ground was covered with a very white hoar frost, and small pools of water were frozen over: the atmospheric pressure made its maximum for the month about this time; but this chilly state was of short duration, for the temperature soon regained its usual mildness: upon the whole, rather than vegetation being retarded, it has been accelerated; the fields begin to assume a vernal aspect, the common daisy, the dandelion, and a few other summer flowering plants were seen in bloom at the close of the month. The firmament has been generally overcast, and rain has fallen at intervals, sometimes in large quantities. On the 14th and 15th (the barometer falling) there were frequent squalls of wind, with heavy showers of hail and rain. On the 24th the maximum temperature took place, at bed-time, with gentle showers of rain; wind north, which blew pretty strong in the upper regions.
