By the Commissioners for Executing
the office of Lord High Admiral
of the united Kingdom of Great
Britain and Ireland &c

In pursuance of His Majesty's order in Council
dated the 11th instant your Grace is hereby required
and directed to cause a general Embargo to be
forthwith laid on all Ships and vessels within your
vice Admiralty which are not cleared by the
respective officers of the Customs except such as
shall be laden by the especial order and under
the Direction of the Lord Commissioners of His
Majesty's Treasury or the Lord Commissioners
of the Admiralty with any kind of Provisions
or Stores for the use of His Majesty's Fleet
or Armies; and also except such ships and
vessels as are employed by the officers of the
Navy, Ordnance victualling Transports, Customs
and Post office; But that the said embargo
is not to be construed to extend to colliers nor to
any vessels laden with corn, or any sort of Grain
for the purpose of being carried coastwise
nor to any foreign Ships which may be
ready to proceed on their respective voyages;
nor to any foreign Ships which have, or shall
happen to put into any of the Ports of the
united Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland

and have not broken nor shall break Bulk
there; But that all foreign Ships be permitted
to proceed on their respective Voyages provided
they do not carry away any Seamen who
are his Majestys Subjects
