

Memorandum of Agreement made concluded and agreed
upon this Nineteenth day of September in the Year of our
Lord One Thousand eight hundred and eight between
William Bowe of Bollinge ^{with the Parish of Wilmslow}
and in the County of Cheshire of the one part — And
Samuel Braddock of Manchester in the County of Lancaster
Shopkeeper of the other part —

And first the said William Bowe agrees to let or set
unto the said Samuel Braddock all that Inn or Publick
House commonly called or known by the Name of Castle
Grove Inn with the Garden - Stable - Cowhouse
Brewhouse and Out Offices, now or late in the tenure
or occupation of William Mapsey as Tenant thereof - for
and during one complete year to be computed from the
Twenty-ninth day of this present Month at the Rent
of Thirty Pounds - of which Ten Pounds only is agreed
to become due and payable on the Twenty-fifth day of
December next and the remaining Twenty Pounds
on the Twenty-fourth day of June also next ensuing -
Free and clear from all manner of Lays, Taxes, Assessments
or outgoings - The Landlords Property Tax only excepted —
— And the said Samuel Braddock of the second part
agrees to take and enter the said Premises as aforesaid
on the terms and conditions above expressed - And further
the said Samuel Braddock agrees to keep maintain and
deliver all the said premises in good Tenanted and
complete condition and repair during the said term

and

and at the end or sooner expiration of the said term
peaceably and quietly to yeild possession, quit and give up
to the said William Bowes all the aforesaid Premises
in such good and sufficient repair - And further it is
agreed that the said William Bowes shall hold and occupy
the large Stable at the Northerly end of the OutBuildings
in the yard of the said Inn - And also the Shedes now
or lately used as Chaise or Coach houses and now or late
together with the said Stable in the tenure or occupation
of the said William Mapsey with free use and liberty to the
said William Bowes of the yard and all other necessary
conveniences for carrying on the Posting or carriage
Business of or to the said House - And further it is
agreed that all Dung Manure Ashes or Compost made
produced or brought upon any part of the said Premises
shall be considered as the Property of the said William Bowes
with power and liberty to take and carry away in carts
or otherwise all such Dung Manure or Compost when
and as often as he the said William Bowes shall think
fit or order so to be done - Reserving to the said Samuel
Braddock all necessary Manure for the aforesaid Garden
but for no other purpose - And further it is agreed
that the said Samuel Braddock shall at his own expence
keep and maintain the said Garden with the pleasure
grounds in neat and clean order and condition free
from weeds and shall at all times permit the said
William Bowes or any person appointed by him to

~~Plant - Transplant - Remove or take away any Trees or
Shrubs he may choose or direct to Plant - Transplant
or Remove to or from any of the said Shrubberys or Pleasure
Grounds -~~
