# PROGRAMME OF THE BRISTOL CELEBRATION.

### RELIGIOUS SERVICES.

From 10 to 11 a.m., at the Victoria Rooms, a Citizens' Service, arranged by the Free Church Council.

From 11 a.m. to 12 noon, at the Cathedral, a Service, to which Nonconformist Ministers have been invited.

At 11 a.m., at the Pro-Cathedral, Clifton, Pontifical High Mass, attended by all the Priests in Bristol.

### CIVIC PROCESSION.

At 10 a.m., punctually, a Procession, consisting of the Mayor, Corporation, Magistrates, and other representative Citizens, will start from Queen Square by way of Queen Charlotte Street, Baldwin Street, Bristol Bridge, Bath Street, St. Philip's Bridge, Broad Plain, the Bath, Old Market Street, Castle Street, Peter Street, Dolphin Street, Wine Street, Corn Street, Clare Street, St. Augustine's Parade, College Green, Park Street, Queen's Road, Whiteladies' Road, Blackboy Hill, to the Downs. On arrival it will be necessary to take the horses out of the carriages, or else to alight and send the carriages away.

At 12 noon, Review on Durdham Down by Col. Curtin, Commanding 28th Regimental District (Capt. A. C. Lovatt, 28th Regiment, as Brigade Major) of the following troops:—

1st Gloucester Artillery Volunteers, Col. A. C. Ord commanding.

The Troops will form in line, facing north, in the following order:—From the right, 1. Artillery; 2. Engineers; 3. Rifles.

The Troops will fire a feu de joie, give three cheers for the Queen, march past in column and quarter column, return to their original position in line of quarter columns, advance in review order, and give a Royal salute.

N.B. The space required for the military movements will be marked off by a chalk line, and it is earnestly hoped that the public will keep clear of it until the Troops march off the ground.

arranging for Bonfires all over the country, a Beacon Fire will be  
lighted near the Quarry at the top of Pembroke Road.

From 10 p.m., on Brandon Hill, coloured fires will be lighted.  
From 9 p.m. to 11.30 p.m. the River Avon will be illuminated  
with Torches and Coloured Fires, and the Suspension Bridge with  
Torches and Lamps.

There will also be a general illumination of the streets and private  
houses of the city with electric light, gas, or lamps.
