And immediately afterwards came the said James and prays to be admitted to the Mesuage or Tenement
and eight Acres more or less of land with Common of Pasture for two Cows.

And also one parcel of Meadow called Goodmans with their Appurtenances lying and being in the village
and common fields of the village of Drayton aforesaid within the Manor aforesaid TO HAVE the Lands by their said
Steward granted and deliver again thereof by the Red To have the premises aforesaid with the Appurtenances to him
the said James for and during the Term of his natural life To hold of the Lords by the Red at the will of the
Lords according to the custom of the said Manor Paying thereon to the Lords by the Red for the premises in the
first Copy 15th 18th for those in the second 4th for those in the third 2nd and a Rent when it shall happen and
performing all other services hencebefore due And the said James is admitted Tenant to the premises and does to the Lords
his Fealty
